- Technical reference
  - Clear use on maps, timetables, etc.
    - Accurate / current (authoritative / reliable)

# Names authorities come in different shapes and sizes

- Default if no names board?
- Centralized national names board
  - all decisions under one roof
  - by sub-committees: feature types, language ...
- Decentralized to regional names boards
  - with central umbrella coordinating authority
    - Is it a board, a council ....?


### Is this good or bad?

# Hungarian Committee on Geographical Names



Responsibility - Under Ministry of Agriculture and Regional Development

Legal basis - Decree 1989 and 1992

**Decisions** – physical and transport features


Advice – administrative names; treatment of names outside Hungary

Members – national mapping, departments of both domestic and foreign affairs; transport; geographical science, education and higher learning; experts in linguistics; local authorities, minorities; major map publishers; national press

Meetings – 3 to 5 times a year








#### More on the Board

- Established by law, act, etc.
- Mandate, responsibilities of members, chair, secretariat
- Board looked to for unbiased judgement
- Decisions are important to future generations
- Integrity and effectiveness of board at stake
- Slow and sure!
- .... political interference

# Names questions in UN cartography

- Which do we use? Clarity or confusion?
  - Bern / Berne; Bangkok / Krung Thep;
    Easter Island / Rapanui / Isla da Pascua
  - Falkland Islands or Islas Malvinas; Myanmar or Burma
  - Kazakstan, Kazakhstan, Kazahstan, or Qazaqstan
  - Array of names for a single place
- UN avoid ambiguity and confusion
  - UNGEGN brochure
    - sets out value of consistent names

### Early days at the UN

- UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) 1948
- First Regional Cartographic Conf. for Asia and Pacific 1955
- ECOSOC resolution 715 A (XXVII) 1959
  - ... foundation stone
- Meeting of first experts group ... 1960
- First Conference on the standardization of geographical names in 1967
  - National standardization
  - Romanization to international standardization



## Achievements - publications



- Two new manuals basic "plus"; technical reference









#### Continuing need for standardization

- Major advances in technology and communication
  - Potentially larger audience
  - Easier to provide and receive data
- Enhances need for standardization
  - Data must be reliable/authoritative
  - Difficult worldwide to meet expectations



#### Some current issues ...

Aim to address Conference resolutions

- Establishing national names authorities
  - local → national → international
- Easy access to up-to-date standardized names
  - e.g. web gazetteer
- Univocity vs. multiple names
  - mapper's dream or cultural reality
  - clear indications for international users
     "Toponymic Guidelines for Map and Other Editors"



#### ... some more issues

- Use of endonyms vs. exonyms
  - aim to reduce use of exonyms
- UN data base dream for single source of toponyms
- Single romanization systems (28)
- Outreach to developing countries
  - training; participation in UNGEGN activities
- Encourage participation of user agencies
- Opportunity to promote work on indigenous names
- Conferences / UNGEGN sessions
  - technical rather than political






# Names around the world ... ongoing issues and progress
